#### Effects your students have gained

Our students were happy to share the experience of the guest artists we received before completing the process of improvisation that we agreed to be the basis of the mural. They were also invited to improve abilities to synthesize what they saw, heard..as this was one of the integrated learning skills they had to develop in their English lessons. In their Arts lessons they could experience partnership in creation: this collective approach with multiple layers helped them learn about the techniques of 'dripping' and 'over all painting' but significantly differ from their usual habits in painting.

#### Points for further improvement

An online platform has been set up to enable professional artists to exchange between Hokkaido, Japan and Brittany, France. We hope this platform will live and possibly feature our students themselves when they start showing their production in the future.
