Cross-cultural understanding	2	Dedicated to the context there was not much cultural exchange. We also do not receive much information about the locality of Japan
Critical thinking (objective, logical views)	4	The students' level of reflection on the problem was very intense, because they are direct witnesses of the situation, having comments and personal anecdotes.
Active learning and action	3	It was worked on in the art course and the Japanese language support. The students covered the subject without problem but the quarantine prevented them from working directly on the mural.
Collaborating with different people	2	There was almost no interaction with the children of Japan, quarantine and health problems complicated the activities
Expressing in words, in shape	4	They were able to express their ideas in texts, draws and sketches about the problem, but they did not get to directly paint the mural due to the quarantine ordered by the government.
